## THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

## **FAITH**

As time passes, we of the Mission are aware of the many opportunities which the Lord is placing before us to grow and develop, spiritually and mentally. Each day that passes brings some new experience which helps us to develop our minds and our faith. This daily growth is part of God's eternal plan for the progression of His children. To us, faith is the basis of all this growth. Without faith in the future purposes and opportunities promised by God, the daily experiences we have would not have so deep a meaning as they now have. Without faith in the future happiness of eternal life, we might be unable to remain faithful to the laws and commandments of God here in this life. When we see our work and our hopes sometimes destroyed by the forces of evil, it is faith in the eventual victory of righteousness which permits us to start again to build hopes and remake our lives. Thus we can see it is very true that without faith we would be unable to accomplish the many things we can now accomplish. The Apostle Paul once said, "Without faith it is impossible to please God." (Hebrews 11:6) We please God by remaining true to the many covenants we have made with him. When we are living the Word of Wisdom, we please God. When we conduct our lives so that others can see our good works and thereby, glorify our Father in Heaven, God is pleased by our actions. When we honor the Sabbath day and on that day worship God, we please God. Do not all of these things come by faith? Again let us read the words of Paul, "But Israel, which followed after the law of righteousness, hath not attained to the law of righteousness. Wherefore? Because they sought it not by faith, but as it were by the works of the Law, For they stumbled at that stumbling stone." (Romans 9:31-32) From this we can see that obedience to the law alone, without faith, is not sufficient. We must have faith to make our obedience to the law complete. How can we gain faith? In Romans we read, "So faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of God." (Romans 10:17) Also from Romans we discover, "For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to I think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith." (Romans 12:3) From these scriptures we can see that faith is a gift of God and every man is capable of faith. Thus, we can see that God is able to judge men according to the way they exercise this gift of faith. Lastly, let

us read the words of Hebrews about faith. "Now, faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things no seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

On behalf of the Mission office, I encourage the members of the Church living in this Mission to develop faith in the future of God's work. Look forward with hope and gladness to the great work ahead. Be confident that God is watching His work here on the earth. Gain God's pleasure through faith and obedience in His eternal laws. By doing this we become faithful children, working out our salvation through gift of faith which God has given to each of us.
