Message From President McBride

"TEACH BY THE SPIRIT"

The Lord described the importance of teaching by the spirit when he said, "If ye receive not the Spirit, ye shall not teach." (D&C 42:14)

As missionaries you meet people who have studied philosophy, world history, languages, science and the arts. You meet people who are better educated than you are. If you don't have the Spirit of the Lord and if you don't teach under the direction of the spirit, how can you expect to accomplish your mission? We cannot compete with the world on its terms. If we are to fulfill our calling, we must teach the Lord's way. If we have the Spirit of the Lord to guide us, we can teach any person, no matter how well educated, any place in the world. If we are His servants, acting under His spirit, we can deliver His message of salvation to each and every soul.

(1) Requirements for Teaching by the Spirit:

We must keep the commandments and be clean before God so His spirit can dwell in our personal temples. The Spirit of the Lord will not dwell in an unclean temple. (1Cor.3:16-17) We must cleanse ourselves by repentance, by confession when necessary, and by avoiding impure actions and thoughts. We cannot have the companionship of the Holy Ghost if we are in transgression, if we are angry, or if we are in rebellion against God's chosen authorities. If we are to have the spirit with us, we must keep the commandments of God and keep ourselves clean in thought and deed.

(2) Preparation Precedes Power:

We must be involved in the hard work called preparation by studying the missionary discussions, studying the scriptures and studying the teaching of the living prophets.

We must make ourselves presentable and understandable to our investigators. This includes our grooming, speaking clearly and avoiding offending people through ignorance of their culture or their personal family circumstances. Preparation is a prerequisite to teaching with power by the spirit.

(3) Being Led By the Spirit:

We must desire to be led by the spirit and be willing to put aside all our preparation and follow the spirit's direction. We must treasure up in our minds the teachings of the gospel (D&C 84:85)

When teaching the message of the restoration and the other missionary discussions, you should make specific preparations by studying all the discussions, studying the scriptures, and praying specifically to know the needs of the family or individual that is being taught. Every morning during companionship study, you will create teaching outlines to meet the needs of the people you will teach that day. Most of the time you will carry through with your preparation but sometimes there will be an authentic impression to leave something out or to add something. We should make careful preparation, but should not be exclusively bound to that preparation. Teach from the heart and let the spirit guide you as you teach these special children of our Heavenly Father.

The Adjusted way of Teaching by the Spirit is producing wonderful results in our Mission. Our teaching pool, discussions and baptisms have increased significantly over the past few months. Many more families are being united through baptism.

We have the gift of the Holy Ghost, and the right to the constant companionship of the Spirit of the Lord to: (1) testify of the Father and the Son, (2) lead us into truth, (3) teach us all things, and (4) bring all things to our remembrance. Let us go forward with faith, teach by the spirit, and bring many more souls unto Christ.

So we ran out to the car and got our last video in Spanish and gave it to him. He then told us that he wanted us to come back the next day to teach him and his family. So the next day Elder Estrada and I went over and taught the most spiritual first discussion ever. Before we ever started Brother and Sister Montes told us that they wanted to come to church, just because they liked the video. As we taught the discussion there wasn't a dry eye in the room. As we finished the "Pray Now" there was this peaceful silence in the room. Then before we could ask Brother Montes he said he knew that Joseph Smith was a prophet. When we invited them to be baptized they both said yes. Their only concern was that they were moving in 2 1/2 weeks. We told them that wasn't a problem and they said okay. On August 30, 2001, Rafael and Maria Montes entered the waters of baptism. The gospel really does change lives. I've seen that so many times. It has to be true.

We walk for miles and miles, each and every day. Sharing this gospel message, to all along the way.






